
Dear Sisters:

Collect combs, brushes, toothpaste and tooth brushes, shampoo, socks, etc. and donate these items to homeless shelters or Veterans residences. Recycle aluminum can pop-tops to a local Ronald McDonald House. Collect Box Tops for Education and donate to local schools.
