
Celebrate with Cards

HOW I ORGANIZED THE NATIVE DAUGHTERS By Lilly O. Reichling, founder of the NDGW Order September 9, 1901

"Miss Jones is most cordially requested to be present at the NSGW reading- room at precisely 1:30 P.M. on Saturday, September 11, 1886...

That is exactly the working of the twenty-four notes that I sent out when I had the founding of the Native Daughters in mind."

The second meeting was held on September 25th, now known as Founder's Day honoring Lilly O. Reichling.
